Sulzbacher helped Vanessa go from homeless to hopeful.


eaten down, afraid, alone — that's how Vanessa seemed when she came to us, but now this mom is confident and empowered, thanks to your support.

Vanessa is also empowered by the job training she receives. She's taking courses to become a medical technician and is enjoying the opportunity to learn. It's challenging and rewarding. And soon, she'll have the training she needs to start a new career.

You're making Jacksonville a more caring place for all of us. Thank you!



Thanks to you, Sulzbacher Village is now a reality.



The Village is a community with housing for single women, female veterans and single- and two-parent families. There are 70 units to accommodate 310 people, and they'll benefit from:

- Job training and life skills classes.
- Medical respite unit for women coming from area hospitals.
- Pediatric health center offering medical and behavioral services.
- Early-learning center for children to prepare them for school.
- Computer lab, fine arts, homework help and mentoring for kids.
- Special programs for female veterans.

"Sulzbacher Village will be a real neighborhood for women and children," says MJ Easterling, our Board Chair.

What's more, now that the Village is opening, our existing center will expand its housing for men, along with programs for male veterans and medical care. Everyone wins! This is a milestone for Sulzbacher and our mission. We couldn't have done it without you — thank you!
